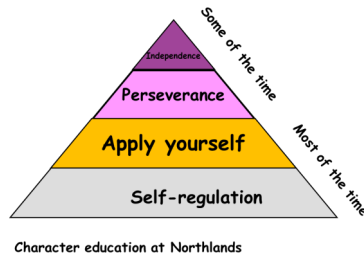


Choir
